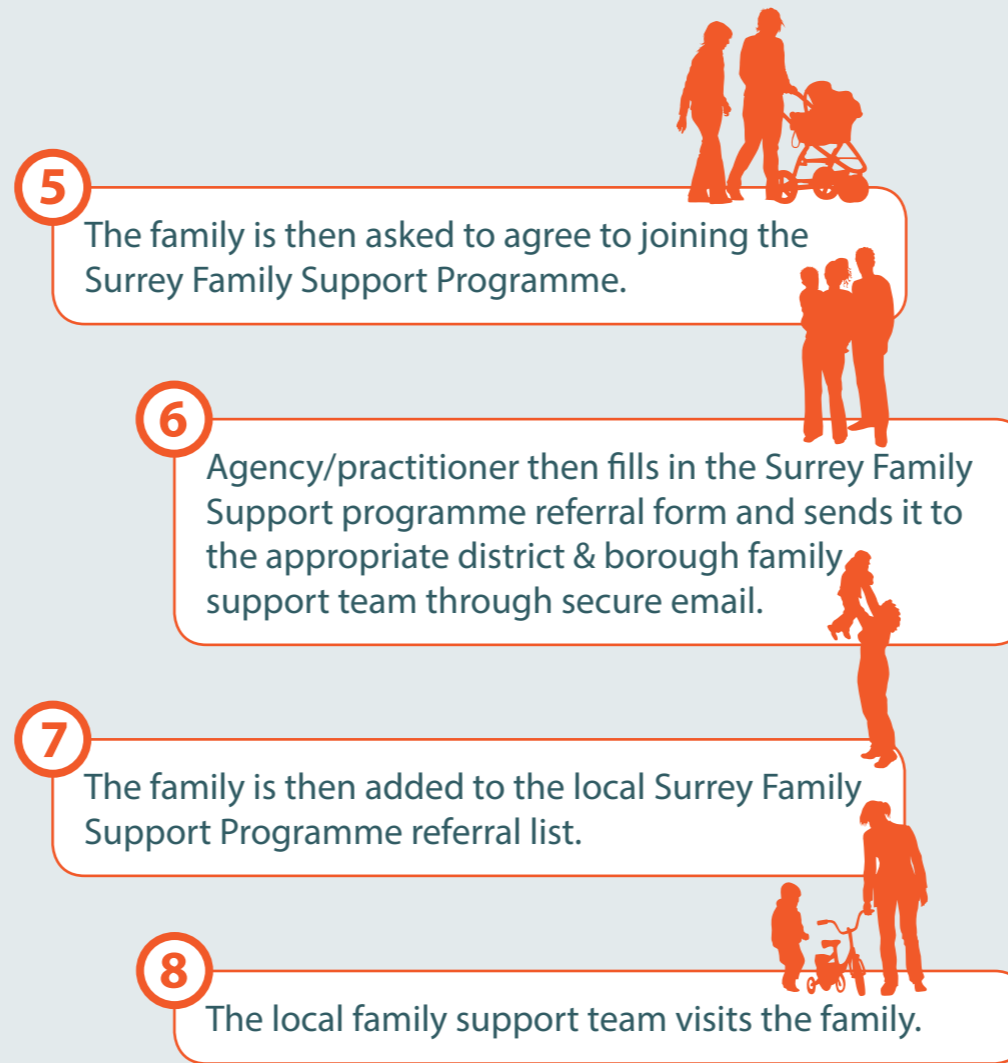
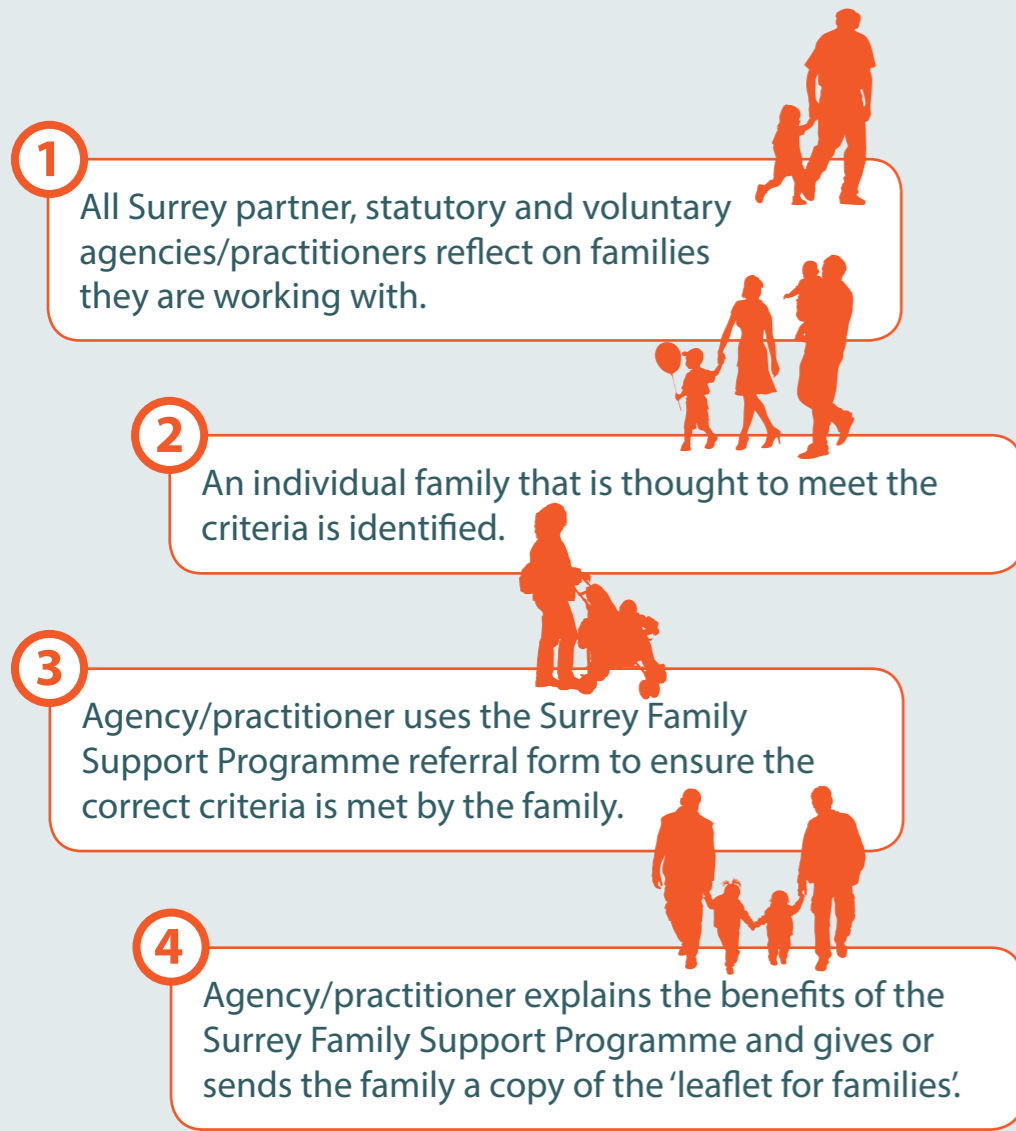

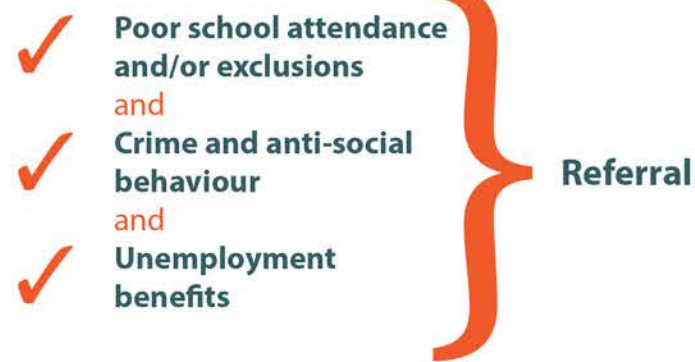

Should a family you work with be referred to the Family Support Programme?



If a family you are working with has these three issues:
 • poor school attendance and/or exclusions
 • crime and anti-social behaviour
 • unemployment
 then the family should be referred.



If a family you are working with has any two of these issues:
 • poor school attendance and/or exclusions
 • crime and anti-social behaviour
 • unemployment
 in any combination, **and** any one or more of these issues:
 • child in need
 • not in employment, education or training (NEET) or at risk of being NEET
 • mental health issues
 • drug and/or alcohol problems
 • domestic abuse
 • multi generational unemployment
 • ex-prisoner in family
 then the family should be referred.
