Introduction

We collect and process personal data in connection with the Council's democratic responsibilities including supporting local councillors. The organisation is committed to being transparent about how it collects and uses that data and to meeting its data protection obligations.

What information do we collect?

We collect and process a range of information about you. This includes:

- your name, address and contact details, including email address and telephone number;
- date of birth, for the purposes of grant aid
- gender

We collect this information in a variety of ways. For example, data is collected through correspondence with you or your representative.

Why do we process personal data?

Processing personal data is necessary to meet our democratic responsibilities which is a task carried out in the public interest.

Who has access to data?

Your information may be shared with the parties set out below for the purposes stated above.

- Councillors, where you are being assisted in dealing with a complaint
- Other council departments

We require all third parties to respect the security of your personal data and to treat it in accordance with the law. We do not allow our third-party service providers to use your personal data for their own purposes and only permit them to process your personal data for specified purposes and in accordance with our instructions and

data protection laws. They are also obliged to implement appropriate technical and organisational measures to ensure the security of data.

The organisation will not transfer your data to countries outside the European Economic Area.

How do we protect data?

We take the security of your data seriously. The organisation has internal policies and controls in place to try to ensure that your data is not lost, accidentally destroyed, misused or disclosed, and is not accessed except by its employees in the performance of their duties. Data will only be processed by members of staff authorised by the Data Controller for this purpose. Access to our systems is limited to authorised members of the democratic services team whose job role requires access to the personal data.

For how long do we keep data?

LGO decisions, Councillor and Ex- Councillor service records – indefinitely

Complaints about councillors (from when the individual ceases to be a Councillor) – 7 years

Admin files (paper and pc), Agendas /minutes, Grant aid applications, Petitions, Councillor declarations of interest forms (from when the individual ceases to be a Councillor), Street and house to house collection records – 6 years

Complaints and compliments records, Background papers – 4 years

Town police clauses act, Street party applications, Councillor data protection registrations – 1 year

Street trading applications – destroyed if not granted, kept whilst current **Your rights**

As a data subject, you have a number of rights. You can:

- access and obtain a copy of your data on request (known as a subject access request);
- require us to change incorrect or incomplete data;
- ask us to delete or stop processing your data, for example where the data is no longer necessary for the purposes of processing;
- object to our processing of your personal data where we are processing for the purpose of a public task or a legitimate interest.
