RE Draft CIL charging schedule

I am writing to lodge my objection to the proposals. Please will you lodge this an as objection and let me know it has been received.

The punitive level suggested for the CIL charge will discourage developers from creating the additional houses that are required for the borough. When the charge was initially proposed a few years ago I believe it was at substantially lower level in the order of 1/3 of what is now proposed.

I understand inflation must be added but at this level it will have a negative effect on housing and also the local construction industry. New house prices will also be pushed up even higher as developers will be unable to absorb the increased costs due to CIL if it is at this level (which on a standard build may add up to 25% of the construction cost). I do hope therefore charging at this level is reconsidered and put at a level which will not

have the above negative impacts.

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a mechanism by which Runnymede Borough Council can raise funds from development toward infrastructure in the Borough. The Council must set out what it proposes to charge development in a CIL Charging Schedule and charges can be based on the type, scale or location of development based on £ per sqm of new floorspace. CIL is a non-negotiable charge and will work in tandem with the current method of raising infrastructure funding from development through Section 106 agreements.
